K'ágee Tu First Nation Environmental Monitoring Coordinator

Job Summary: This is a full-time term position. The Environment Monitoring Coordinator will be responsible for the management, further development, and implementation of a Coordinated Environmental Monitoring Program for the K'ágee Tu First Nation (KTFN) within its traditional land use area. A program framework has already been developed along with a draft work plan for 2011-2012. Duties will include both internal consultation with community members and ongoing engagement with regulatory authorities to ensure KTFN environmental and cultural concerns are addressed.

Reporting Relationship: The Environmental Monitoring Coordinator (EMC) will take direction from Chief and Council with respect to program development and implementation but will report to the KTFN Executive Director on program management and administration matters.

Specific Responsibilities: Guided by the Coordinated Environmental Monitoring Program (CEMP) framework developed by KTFN in 2010-2011, the EMC will:

- Review and adapt the CEMP framework to address current and anticipated monitoring needs;
- Review and respond to Paramount Resources' draft Site Wide Monitoring Program (SWMP) for the Cameron Hills in a manner that ensures protection of KTFN rights and interests;
- Manage and implement an existing Cumulative Impacts Monitoring Program (CIMP) project to meet proposed objectives and outcomes;
- Engage with responsible agencies and departments in a variety of coordinated environmental monitoring activities to ensure that good technical and traditional knowledge information is being gathered, communicated, and shared on an ongoing basis for decision-making purposes;
- Develop and manage a traditional knowledge monitoring program built around the seasonal activities of KTFN harvesters;
- Supervise and mentor an Environmental Monitoring Assistant;
- Internally consult with Chief, Council, elders, and harvesters to ensure full community involvement in monitoring program activities and decisions;
- Ensure that KTFN administrative and financial policies are followed with respect to program management and implementation.

Qualifications: The EMC must have post-secondary certification in a Natural Resource Management or Environmental Science field along with experience in the design and implementation of environmental monitoring activities. Program management experience would be an asset. Experience working with First Nation communities is also an asset. An equivalent combination of training and experience in environmental monitoring and program management may be considered.

Terms of Employment: This is a salaried term position beginning immediately and continuing until March 31, 2012, with the possibility of an extension to the next fiscal year. KTFN prefers that the incumbent live in Kakisa for the duration of the term, once suitable accommodation is found, but is willing to consider a situation where the incumbent maintains a home office outside the community (within reasonable proximity) but spends time in the community on a regular basis (perhaps two weeks a month). Salary is dependent on qualifications but is approximately \$60,000 per annum.
